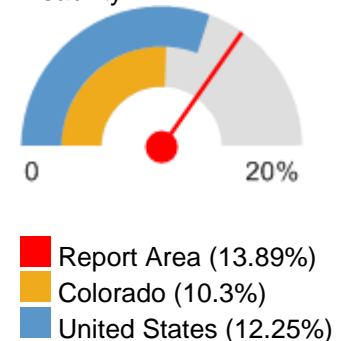

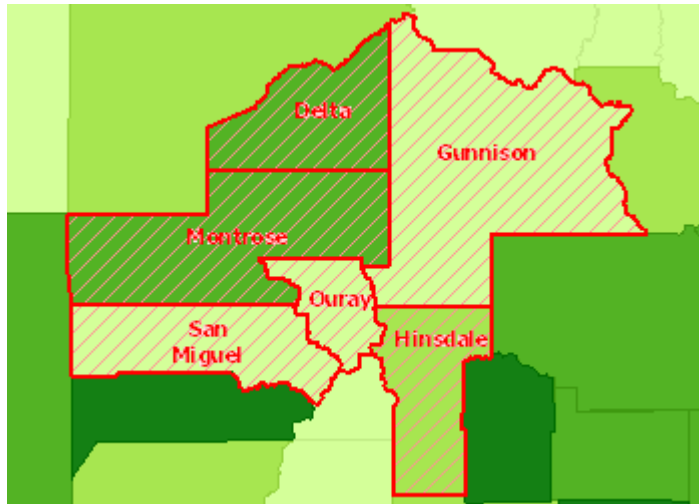

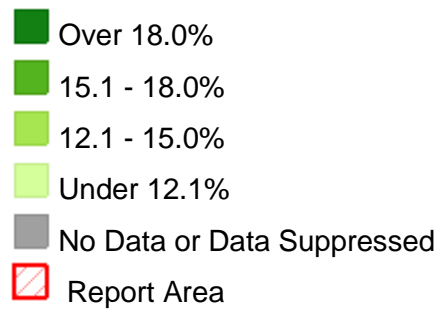

Social Economic Factors

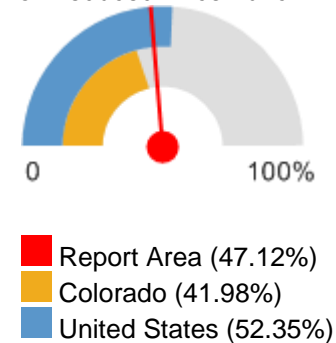

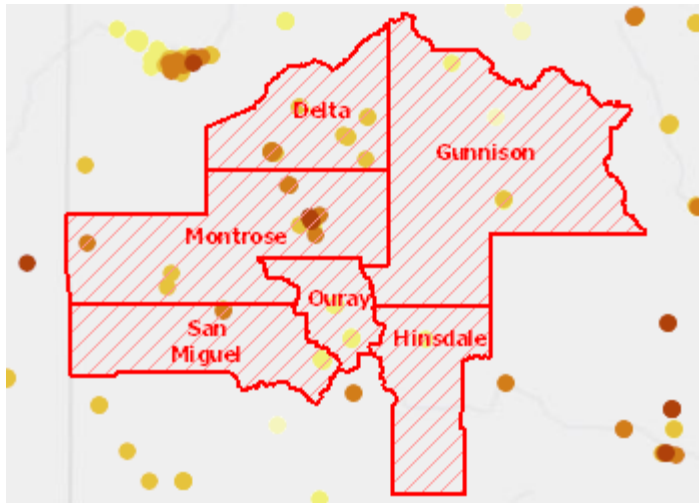

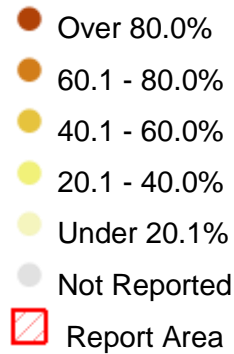
Percent Students Eligible for Free or Reduced Price Lunch

Students Eligible for Free or Reduced-Price Lunch, NCES CCD 2013-14

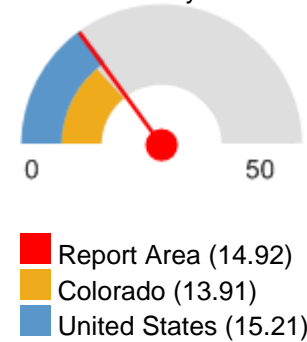


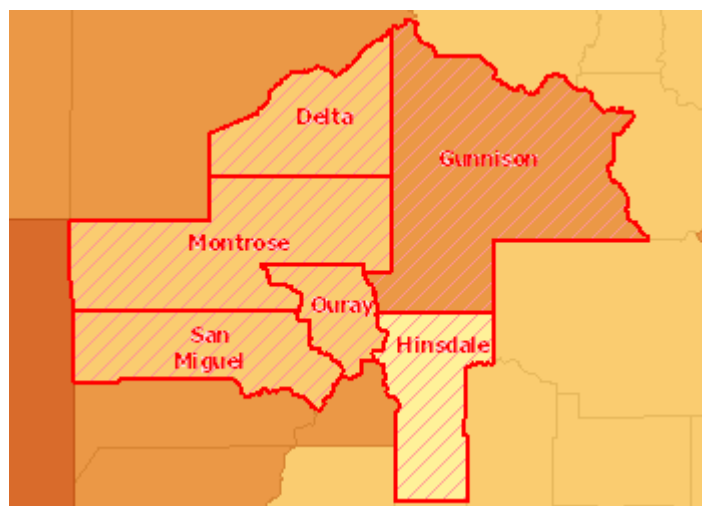

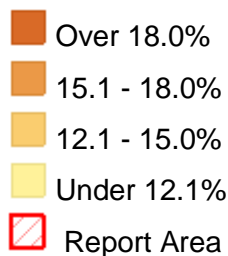

Food Insecure Population, Percent by County, Feeding America 2013

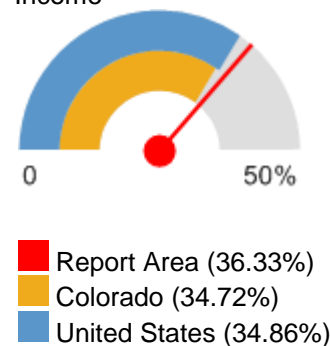


Housing Cost Burden (30%)

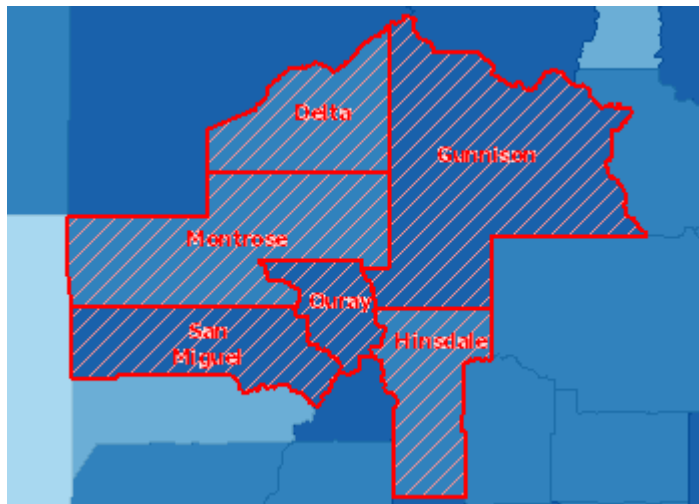

Percentage of Households where Housing Costs Exceed 30% of Income

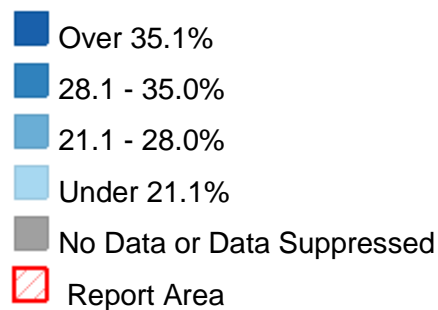

Cost Burdened Households (Housing Costs Exceed 30% of Household Income), Percent by County, ACS 2010-14



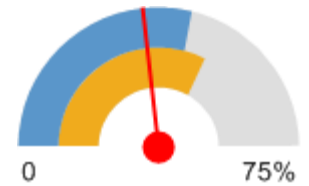

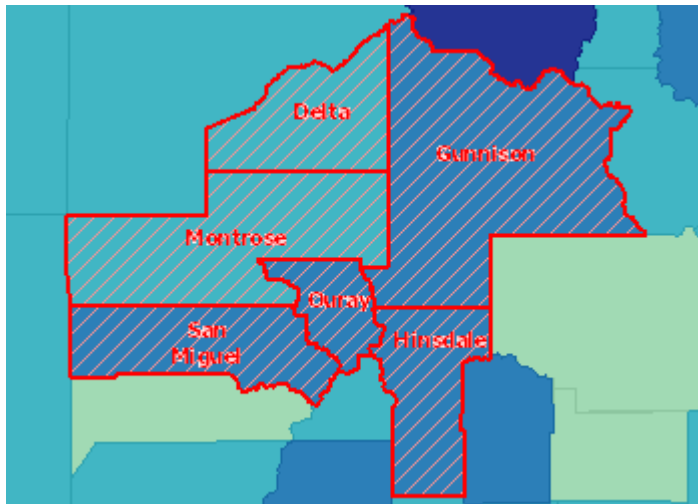

Family Income Over \$75,000, Percent by County, ACS 2010-14

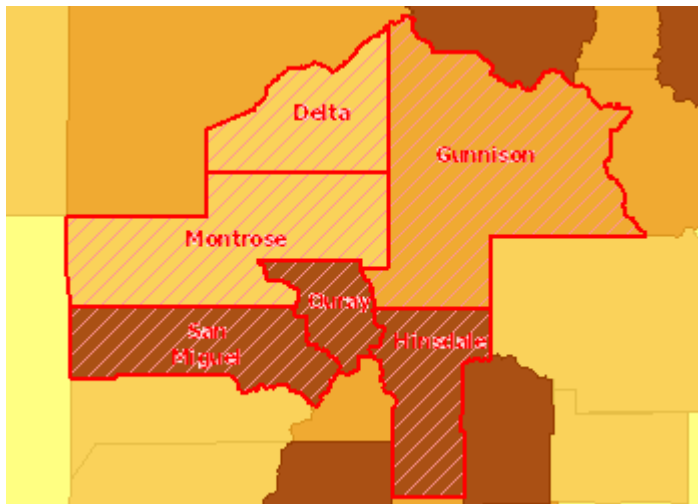
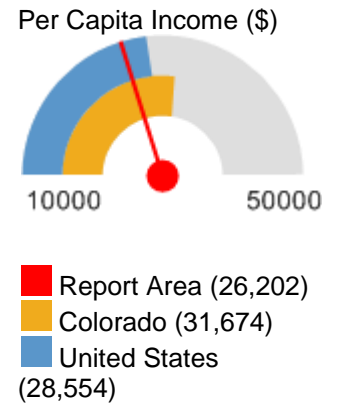

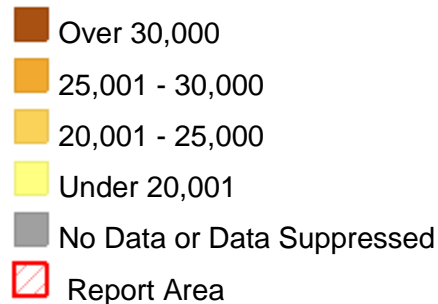

Per Capita Income by County, ACS 2010-14



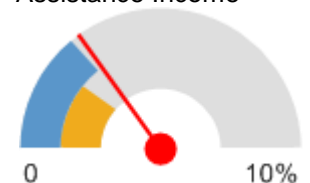

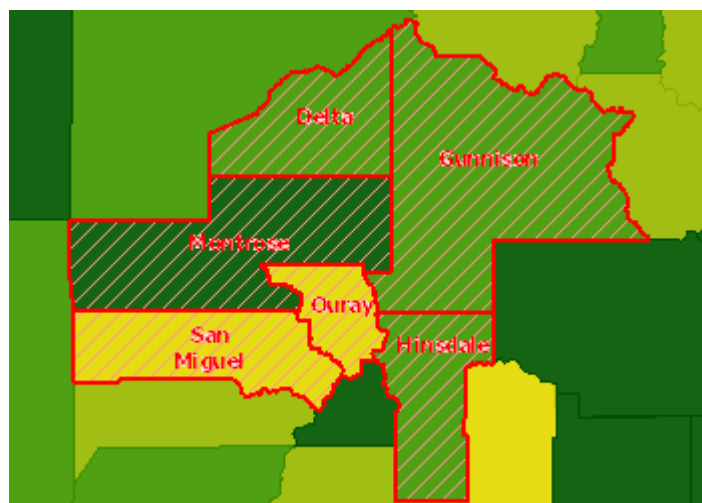

Households with Public Assistance Income, Percent of Total Households by County, ACS 2010-14

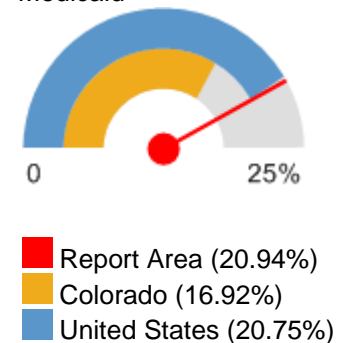

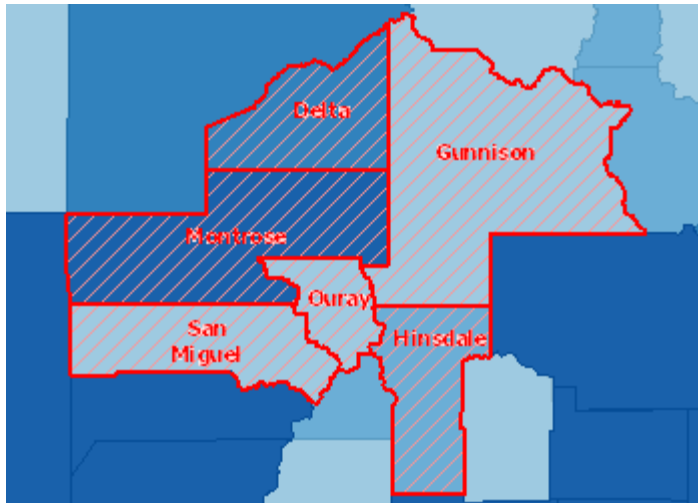

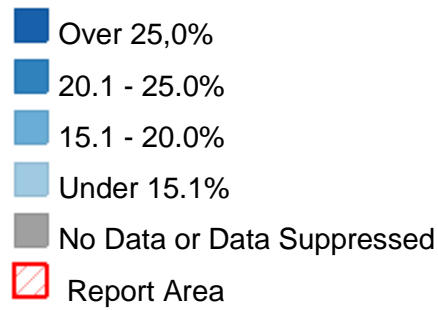
Percent of Insured Population Receiving Medicaid

Insured, Medicaid / Means-Tested Coverage, Percent by County, ACS 2010-14



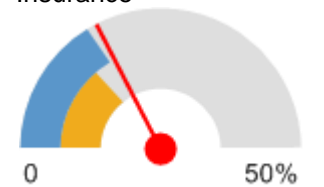

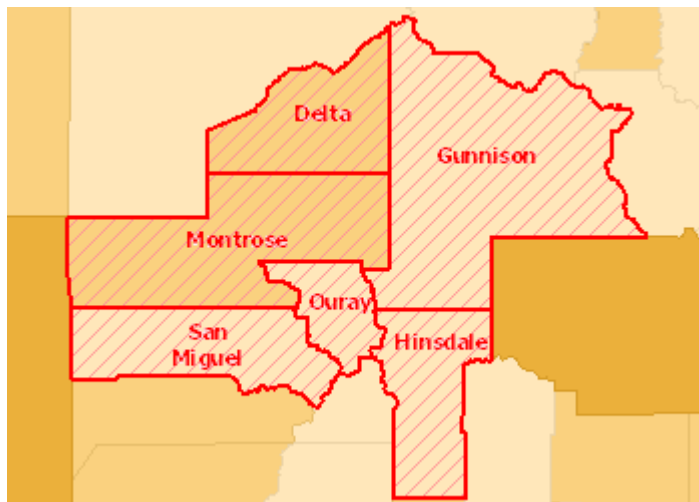

Percent Population Without Medical Insurance

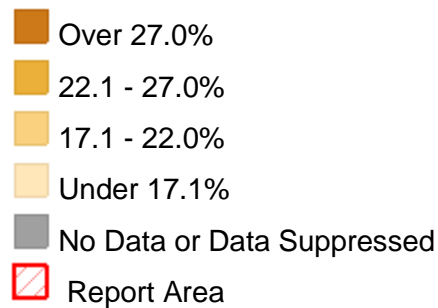

Uninsured Population, Age 18-64, Percent by County, SAHIE 2014



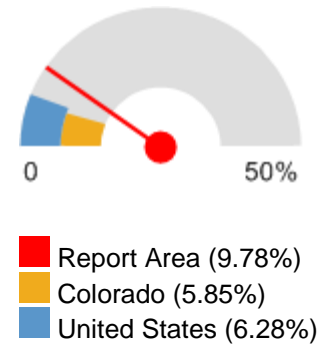

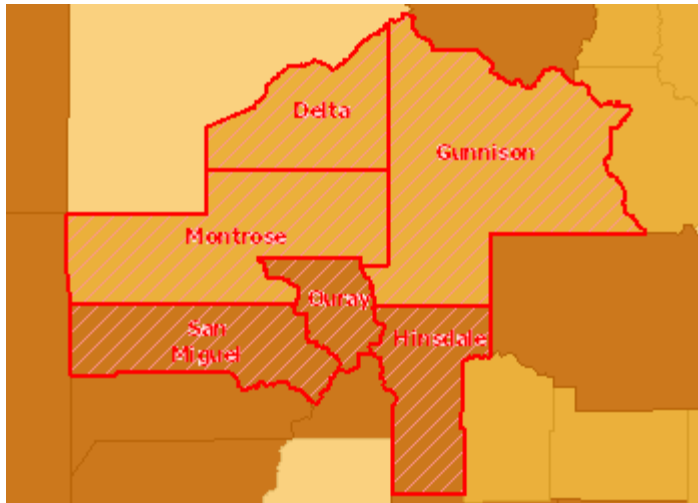

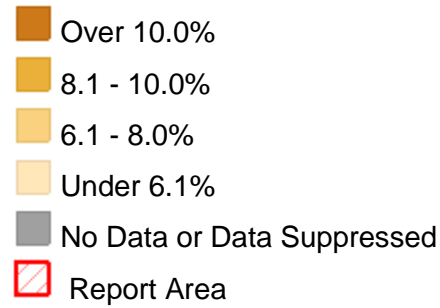

Uninsured Population, Age 0-18, Percent by County, SAHIE 2014



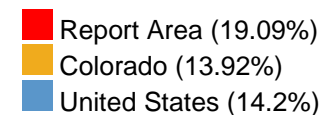
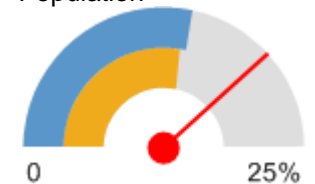

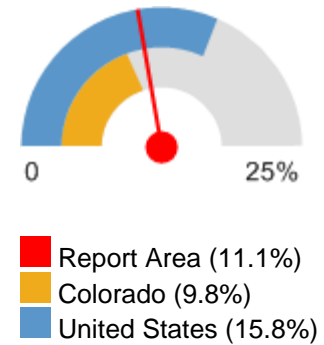

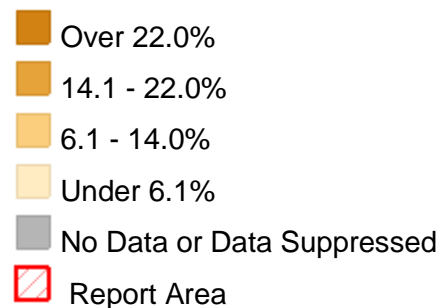

Population Receiving SNAP Benefits, Percent by County, SAIPE 2013

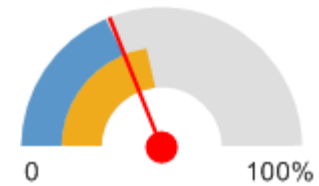

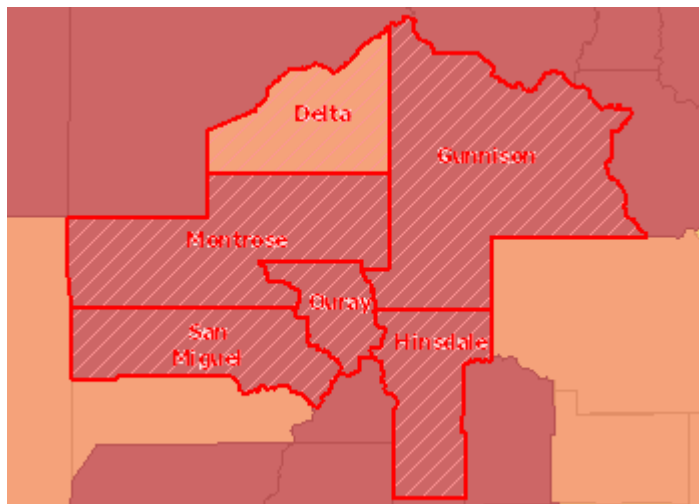

Population with an Associate Level Degree or Higher, Percent by County, ACS 2010-14

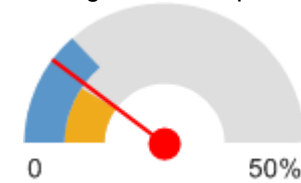

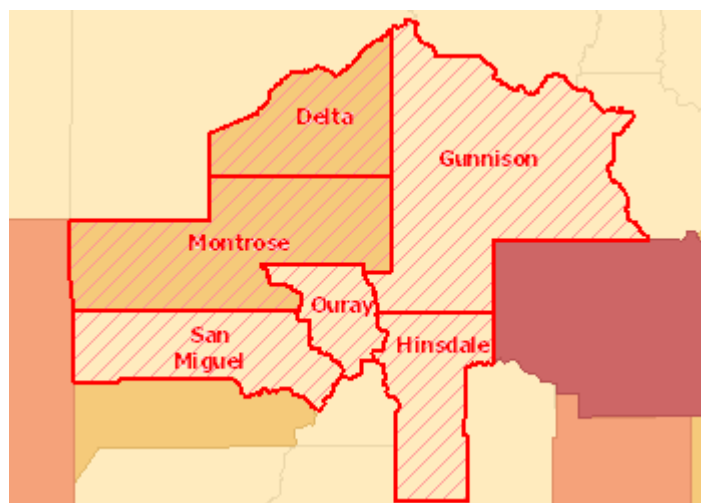

Population with No High School Diploma (Age 25), Percent by County, ACS 2010-14

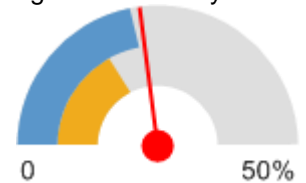

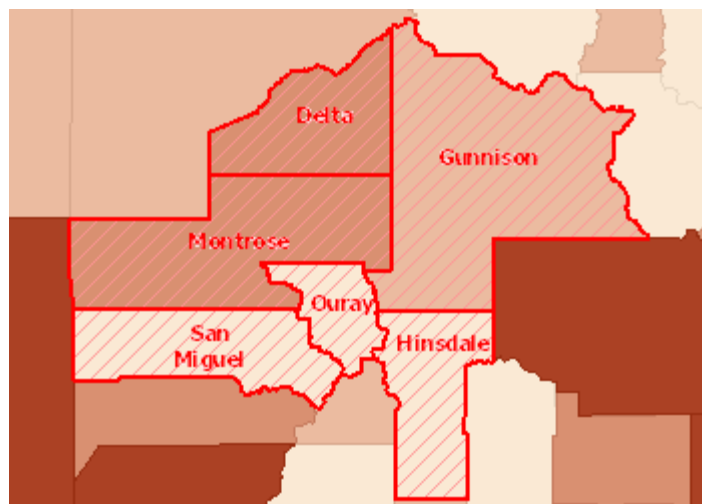

Percent Population Under Age 18 in Poverty

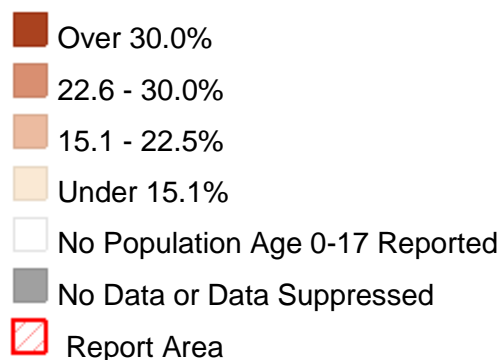

Population Below the Poverty Level, Children (Age 0-17), Percent by County, ACS 2010-14

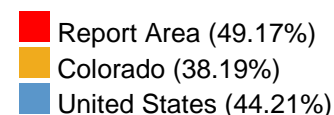
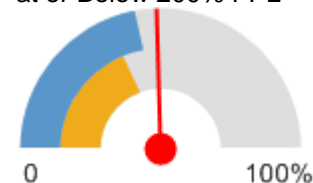

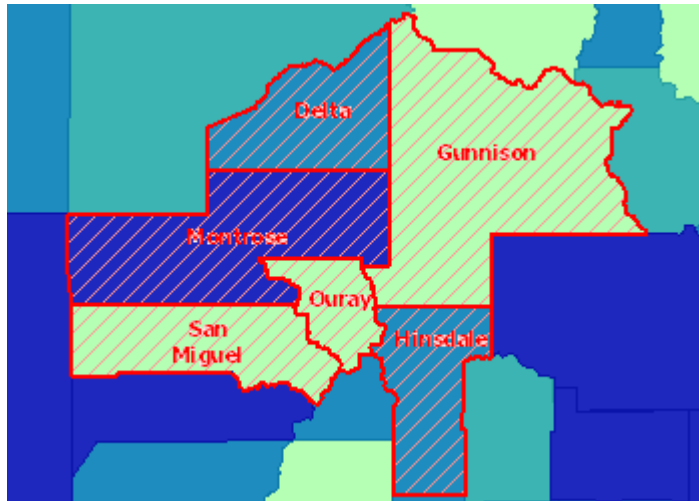

Percent Population Under Age 18 at or Below 200% FPL

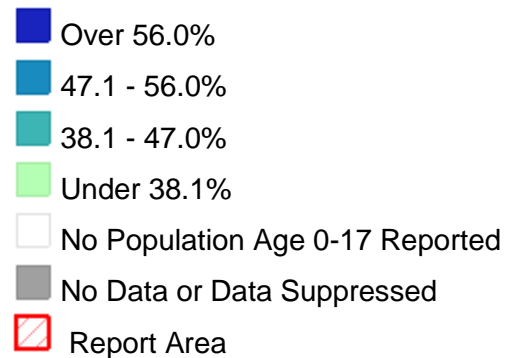

Population Below 200% Poverty Level, Children (Age 0-17), Percent by County, ACS 2010-14



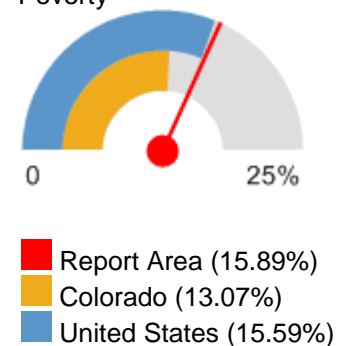

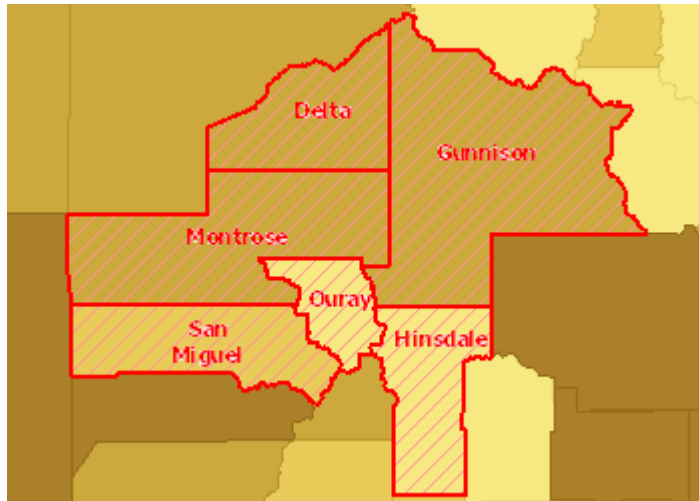

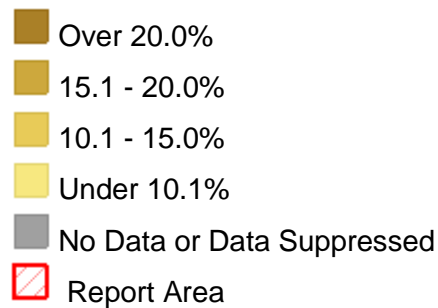

Population Below the Poverty Level, Percent by County, ACS 2010-14

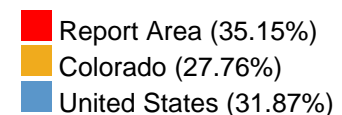
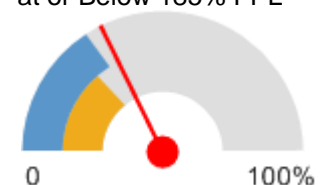

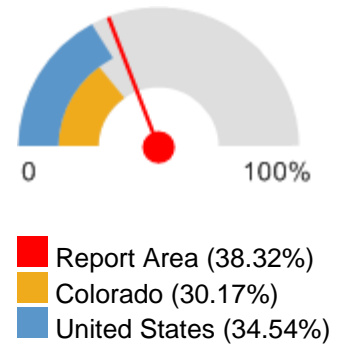

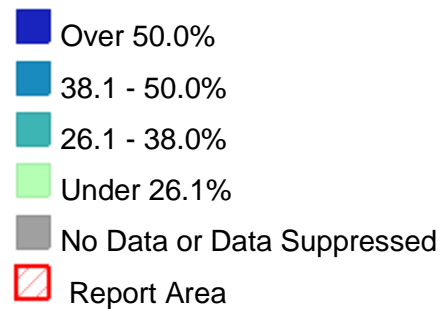

Population Below 200% Poverty Level, Percent by County, ACS 2010-14

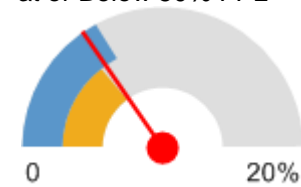

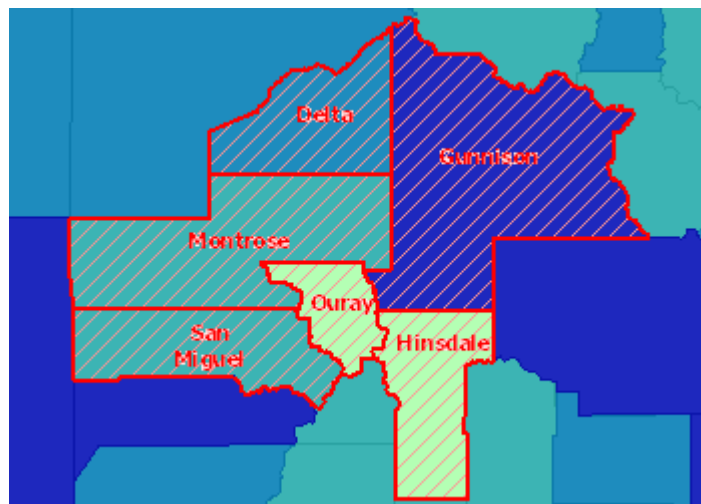

Population Below 50% Poverty Level, Percent by County, ACS 2010-14

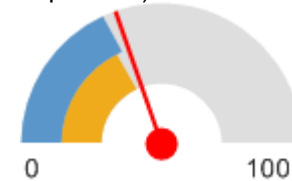

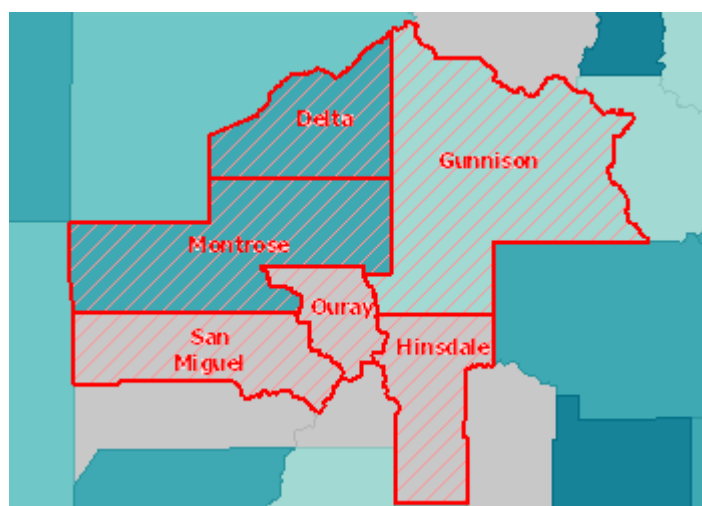

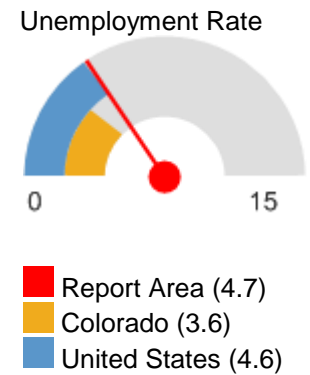
Births to Females Age 15-19, Rate (Per 1,000 Pop.) by County, NVSS 2006-12

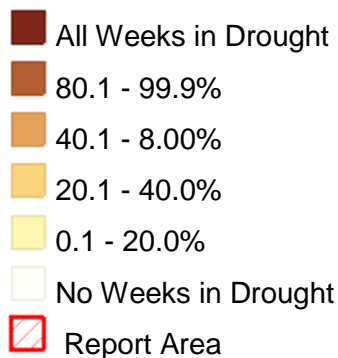
Percentage of Weeks in Drought (Any)

Drought - Weeks in Drought (Any), Percent by County, US Drought Monitor 2012-14

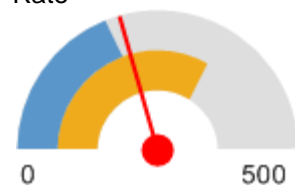

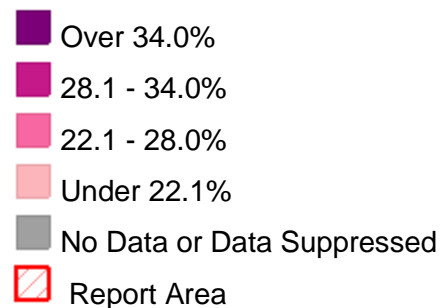

Substandard Housing Units, Percent of Total by County, ACS 2010-14

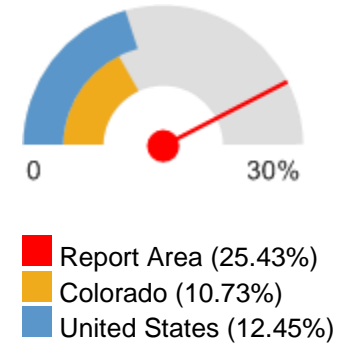

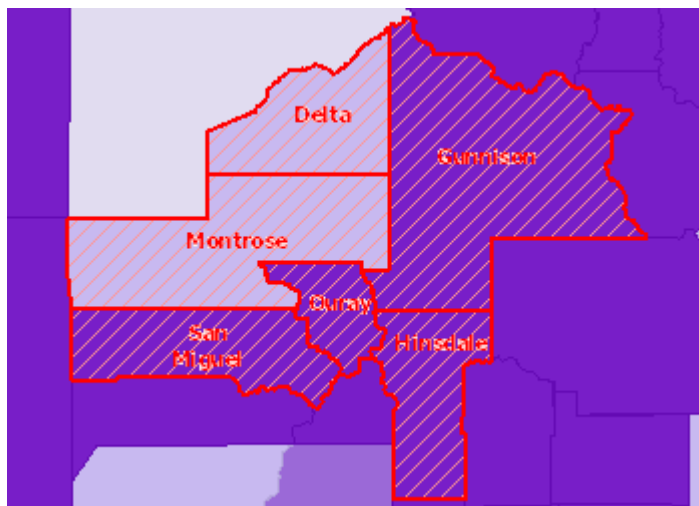

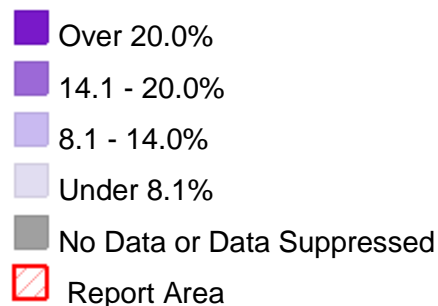
Vacant Housing Units, Percent

Vacant Housing Units, Percent by County, ACS 2010-14

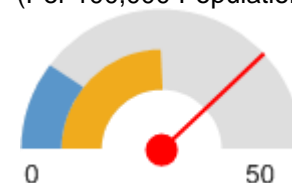

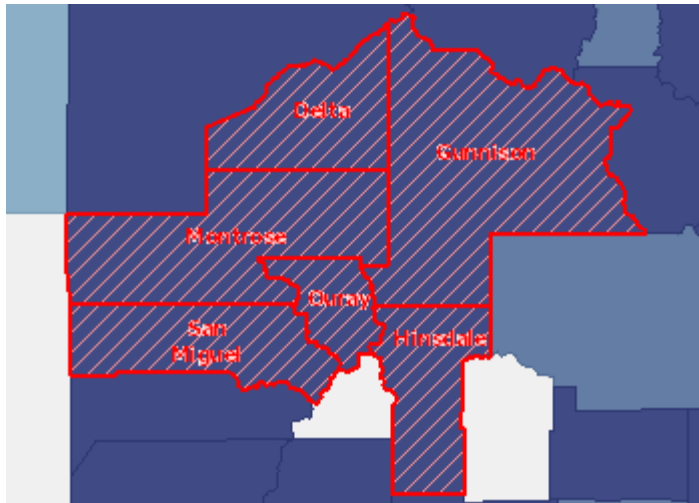

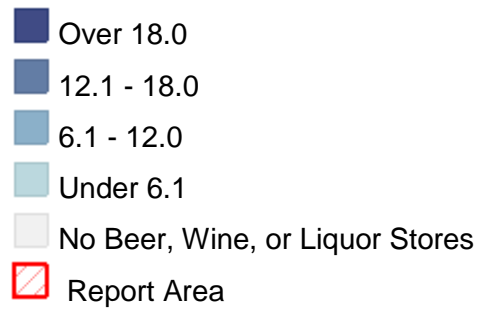

Beer, Wine and Liquor Stores, Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by County, CBP 2013

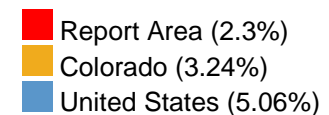
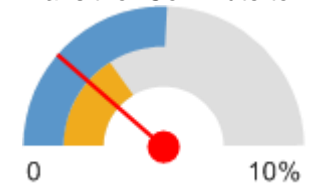

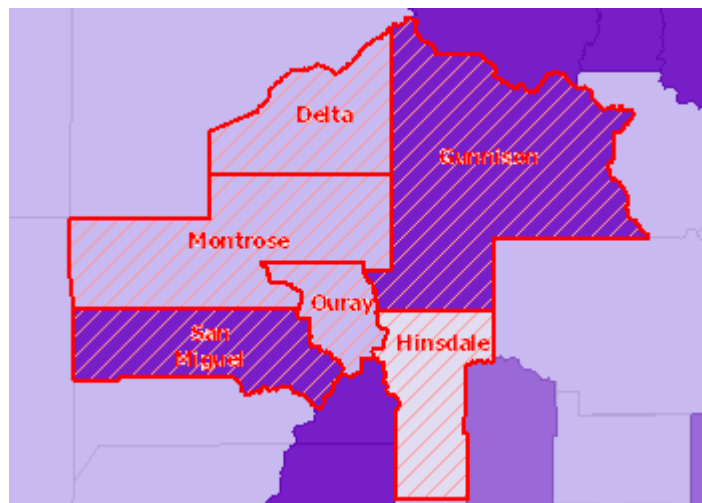

Percent Population Using Public Transit for Commute to Work

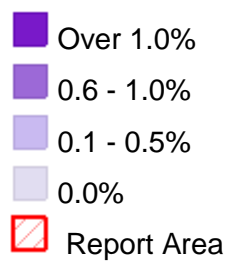

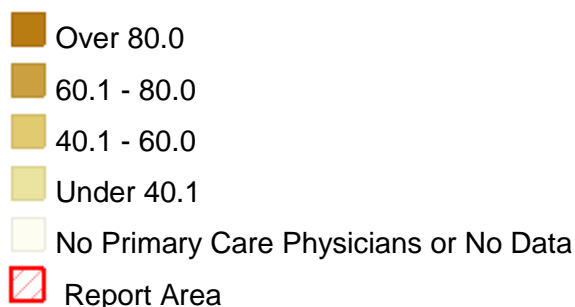
Primary Care Physicians, Rate per 100,000 Pop.

Access to Primary Care Physicians, Rate per 100,000 Pop. by County, AHRF 2013

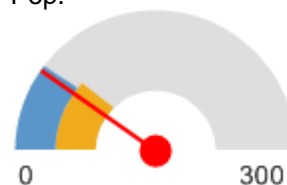

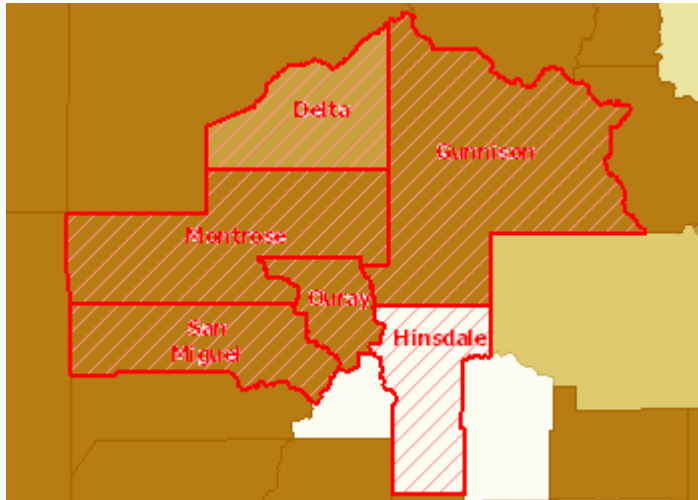

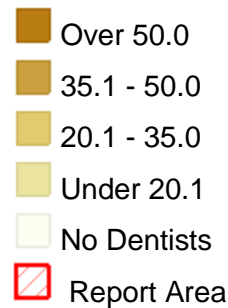

Access to Dentists, Rate per 100,000 Pop. by County, AHRF 2013

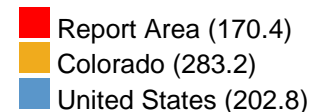
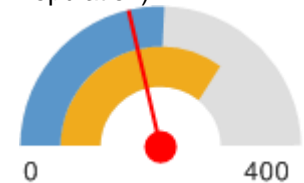

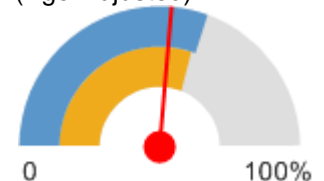
Cervical Cancer Screening (Past 3 Years), Percent of Women Age 18 by County, BRFSS 2006-12

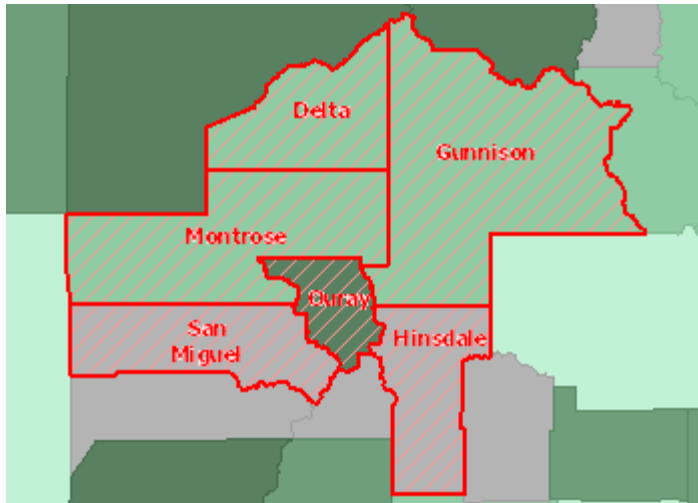

Percent Adults Screened for Colon Cancer (Age-Adjusted)

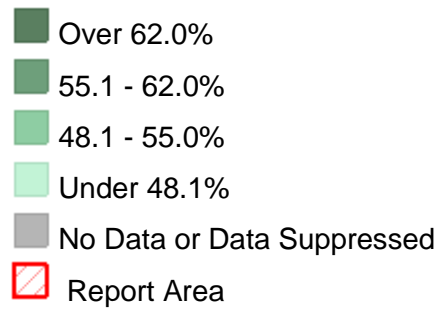

Colon Cancer Screening (Ever), Percent of Adults Age 50 by County, BRFSS 2006-12

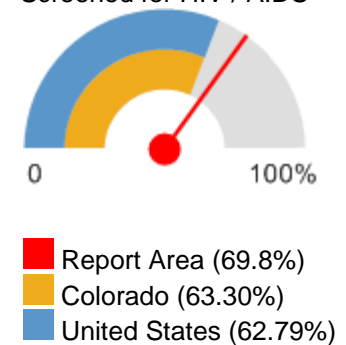

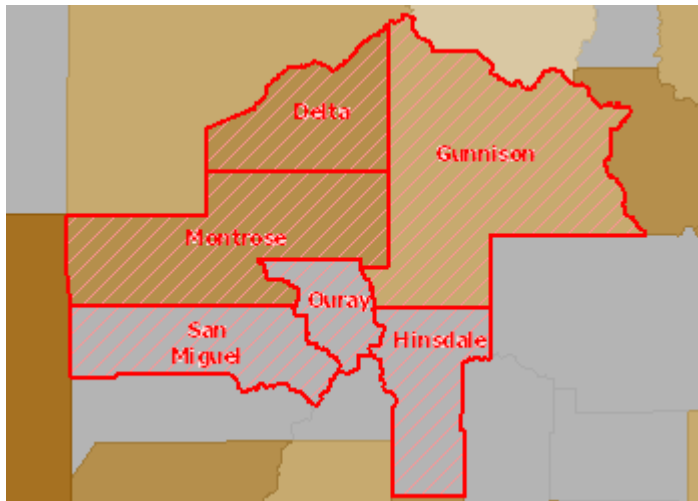

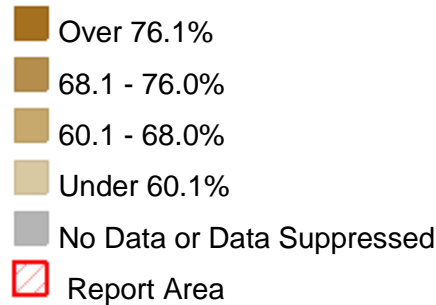

Adults Age 18 Never Screened for HIV / AIDS, Percent by County, BRFSS 2011-12

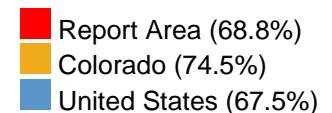

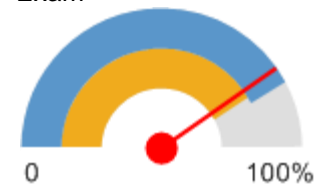

Percent Medicare Enrollees with Diabetes with Annual Exam

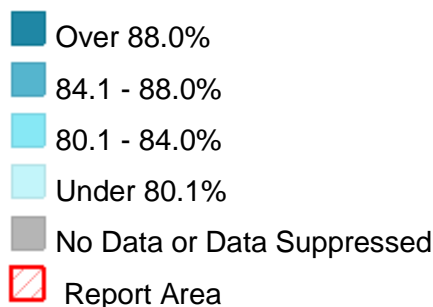

County, DA 2012**

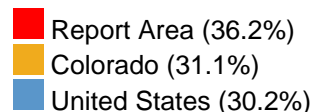

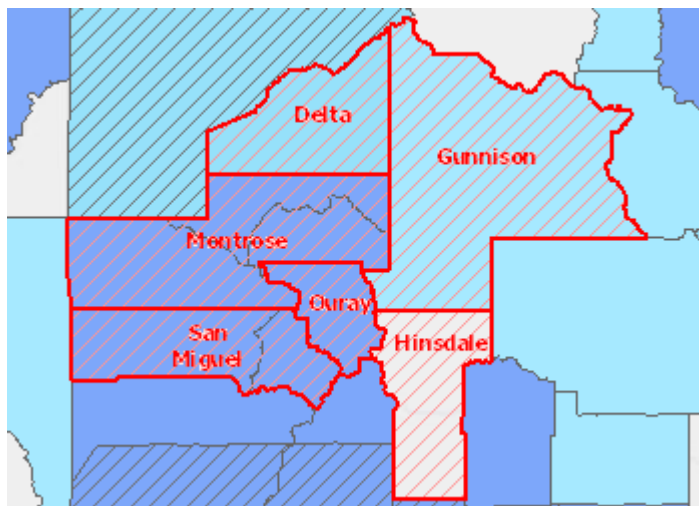

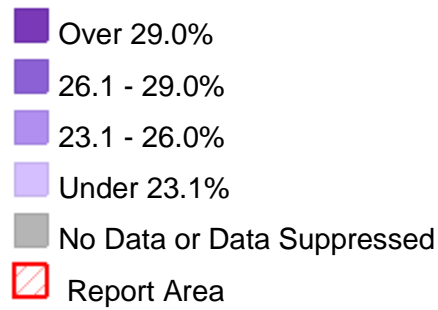
Percent Population with no Leisure Time Physical Activity

No Leisure-Time Physical Activity, Adults Age 20 , Percent by County, CDC NCCDPHP 2013

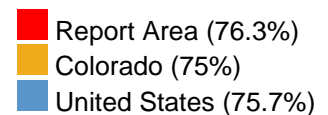
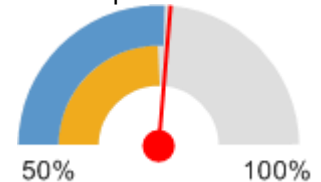

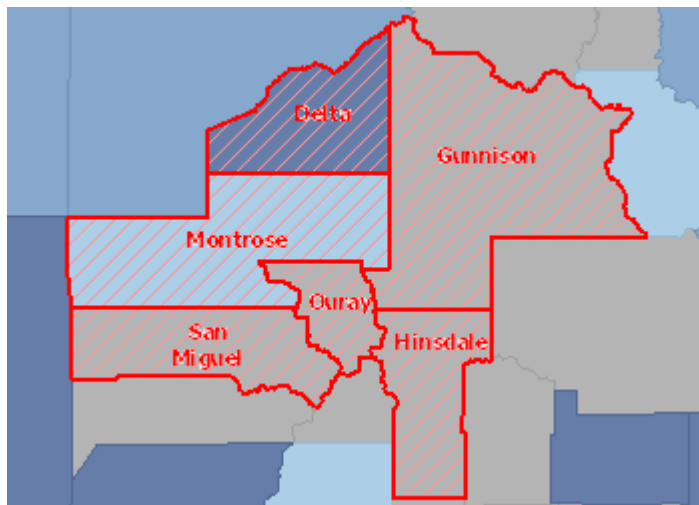

Percent Adults with Inadequate Fruit / Vegetable Consumption

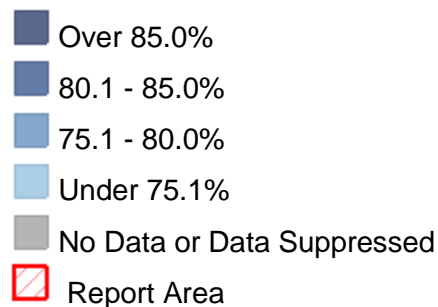

Inadequate Fruit/Vegetable Consumption, Percent of Adults Age 18 by County, BRFSS 2005-09

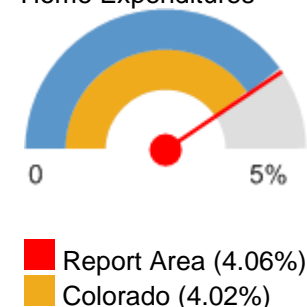

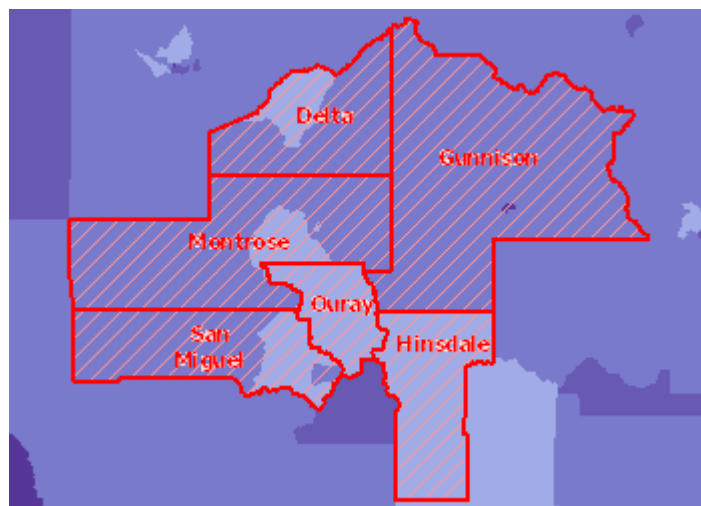
Soda Expenditures, Percentage of Total Food-At-Home Expenditures



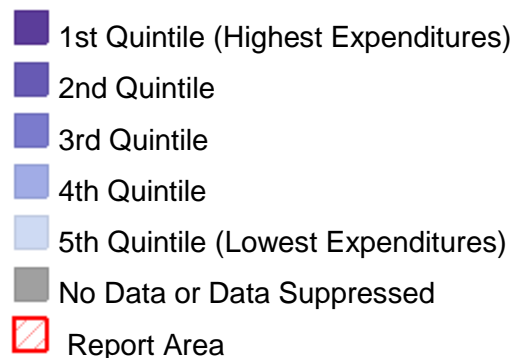

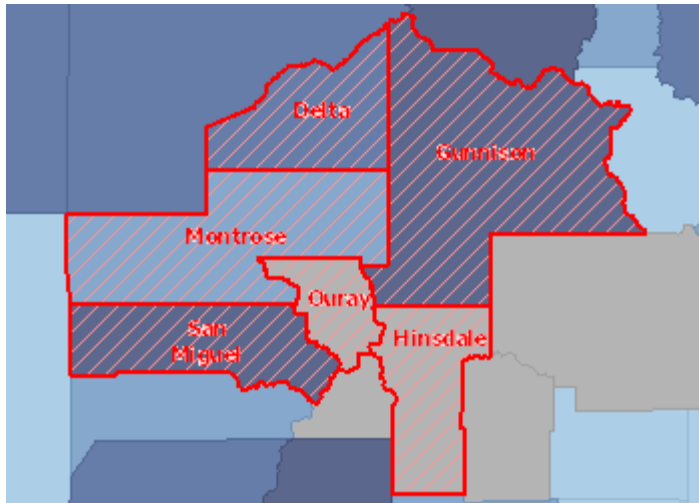

Estimated Adults Drinking Excessively (Age-Adjusted Percentage)

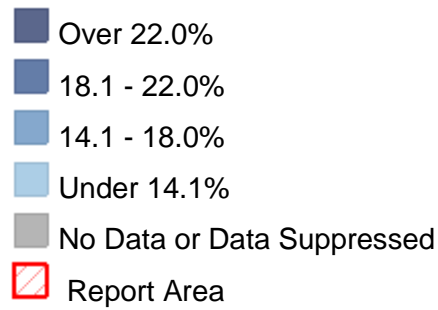

Excessive Drinking, Percent of Adults Age 18 by County, BRFSS 2006-12

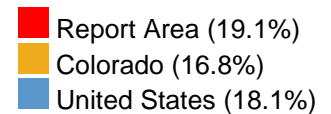
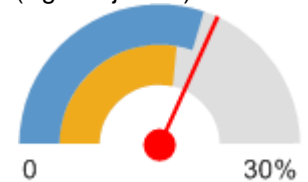

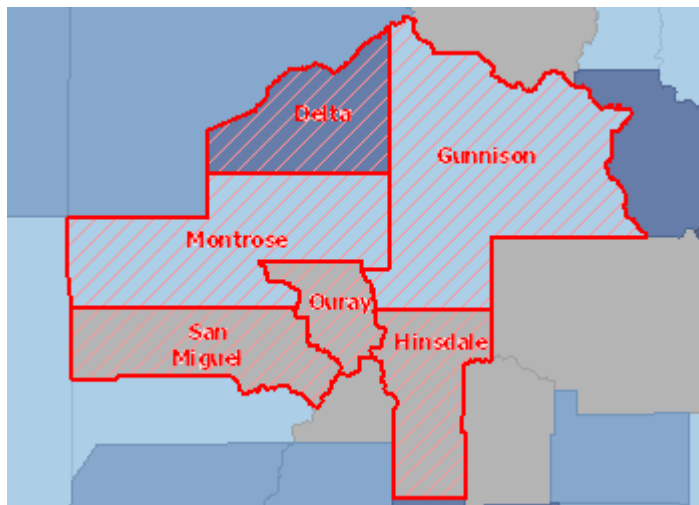

Percent Population Smoking Cigarettes (Age-Adjusted)

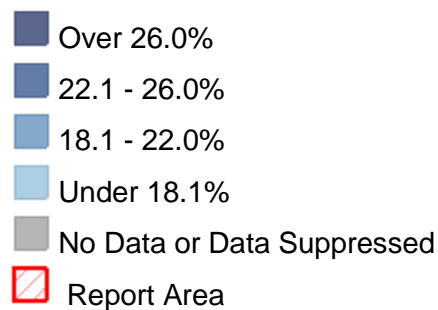

Current Smokers, Adult, Percent of Adults Age 18 by County, BRFSS 2006-12

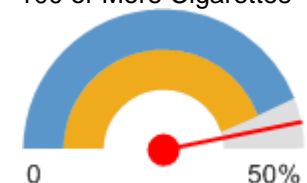

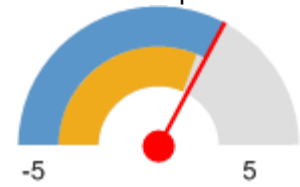

Health Outcomes

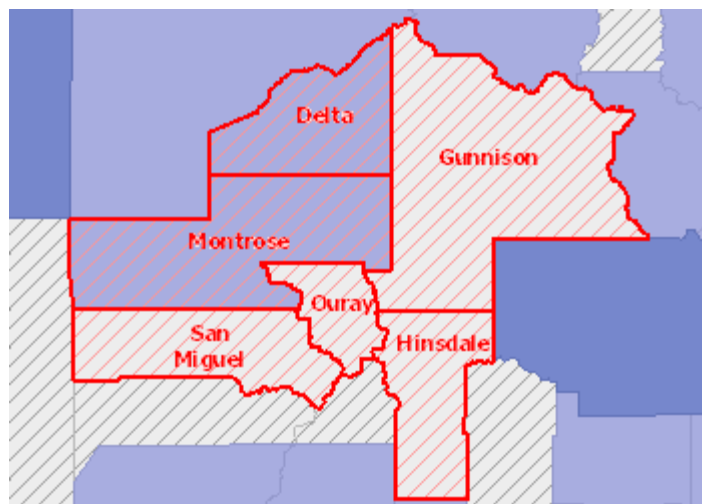

Lung Cancer, Incidence Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by County, State Cancer Profiles 2008-12

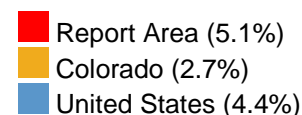
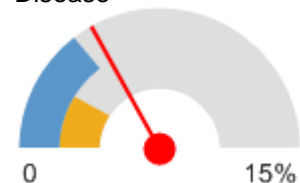

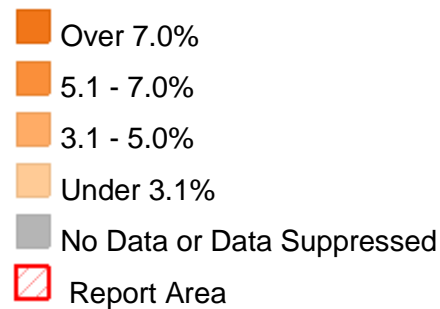

Heart Disease (Diagnosed), Percentage of Adults Age 18 by County, BRFSS 2011-12

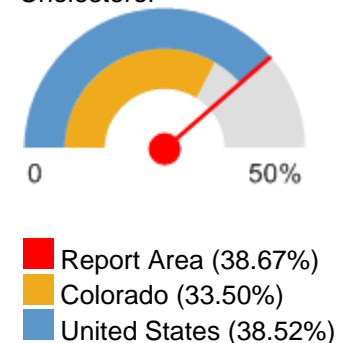

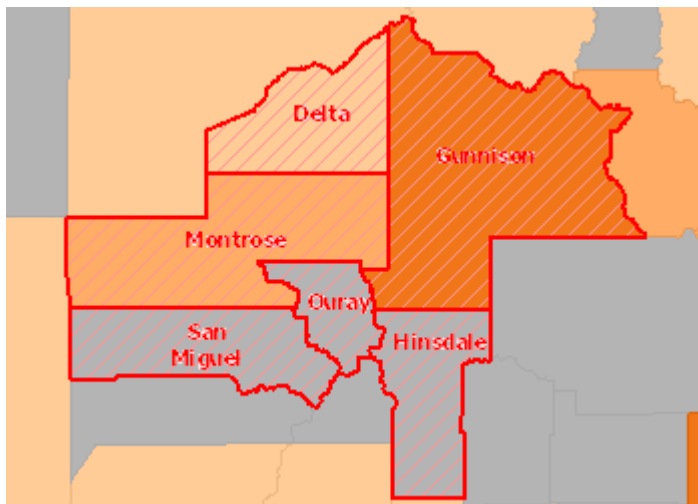

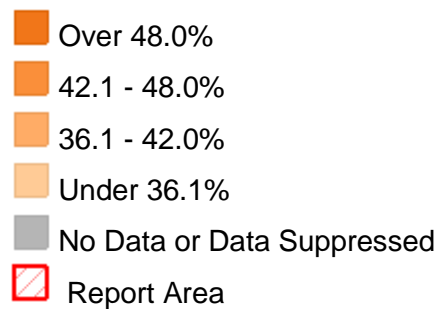

High Cholesterol (Diagnosed), Percentage of Adults Age 18 by County, BRFSS 2011-12

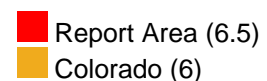
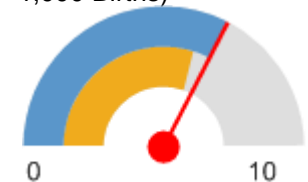

Infant Mortality, Rate (Per 1,000 Live Births) by County, AHRF 2006-10



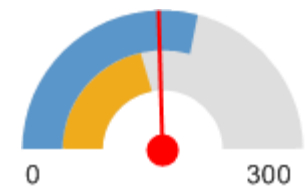

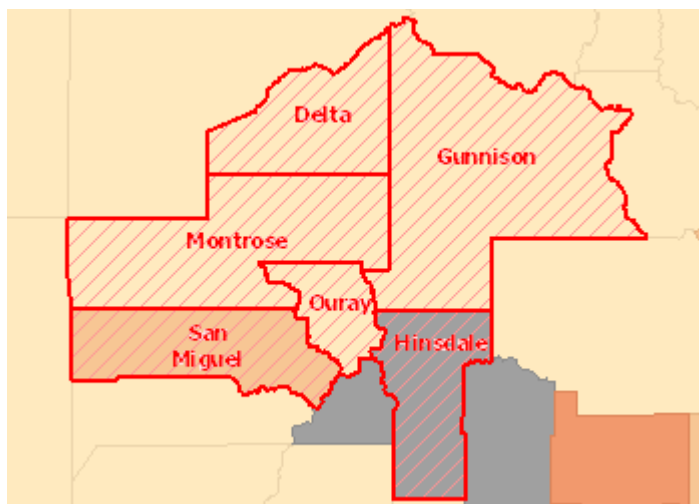

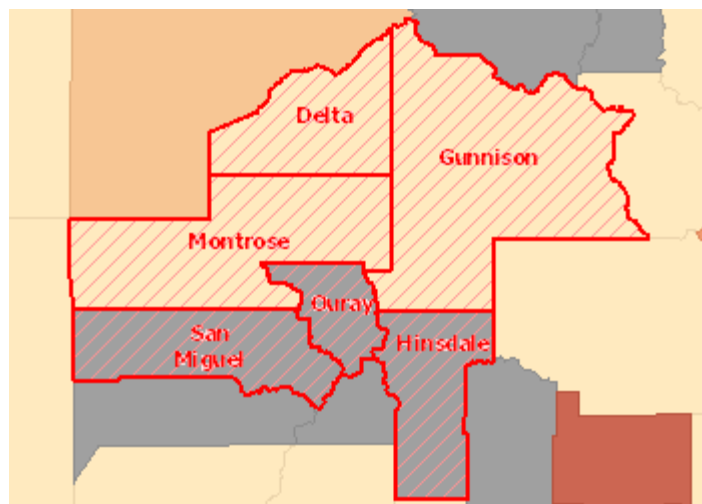

Coronary Heart Disease Mortality, Age-Adjusted Death Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.)

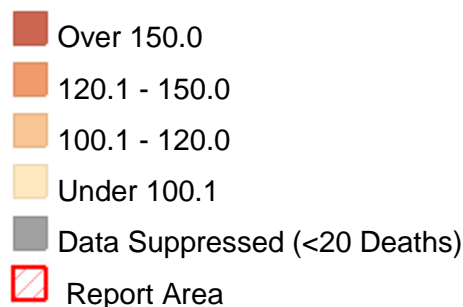

Ischaemic Heart Disease Mortality, Age Adj. Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by County, NVSS 2009-13

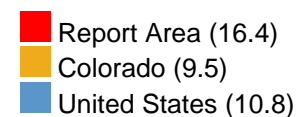
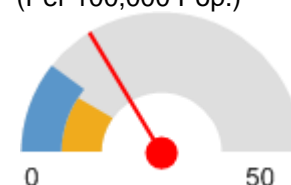

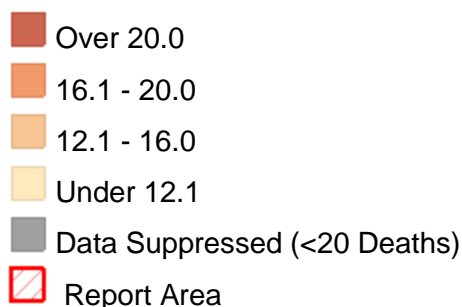

Suicide Mortality, Age Adj. Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by County, NVSS 2009-13

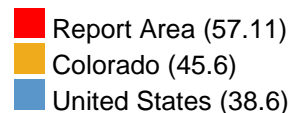
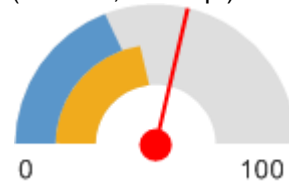

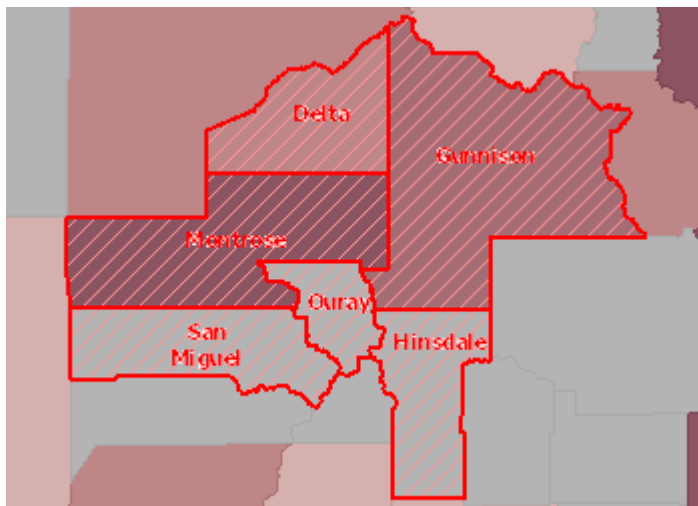

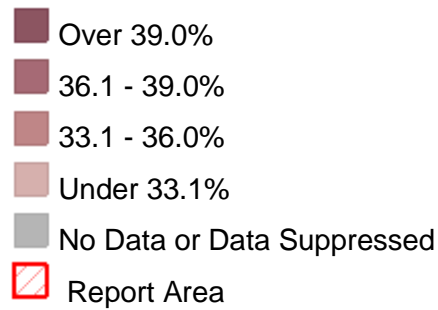

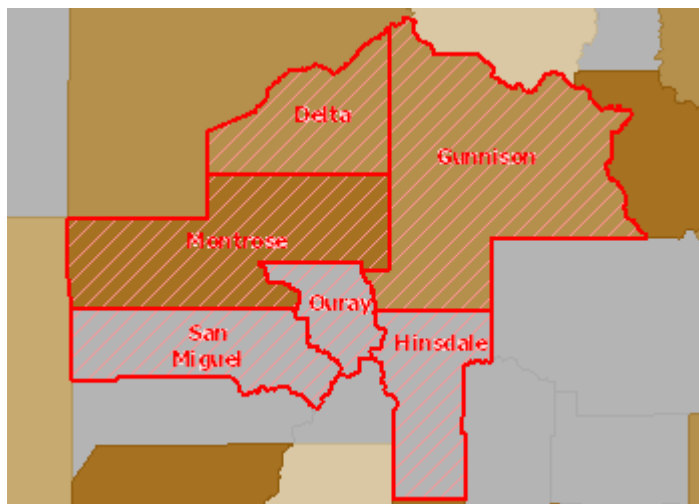

Adults Age 18 Without Dental Exam in Past 12 Months, Percent by County, BRFSS 2006-10

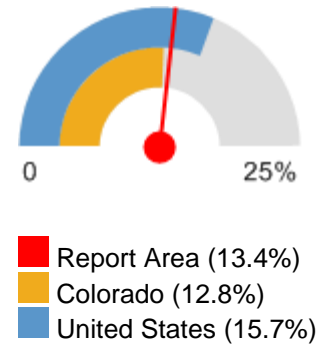

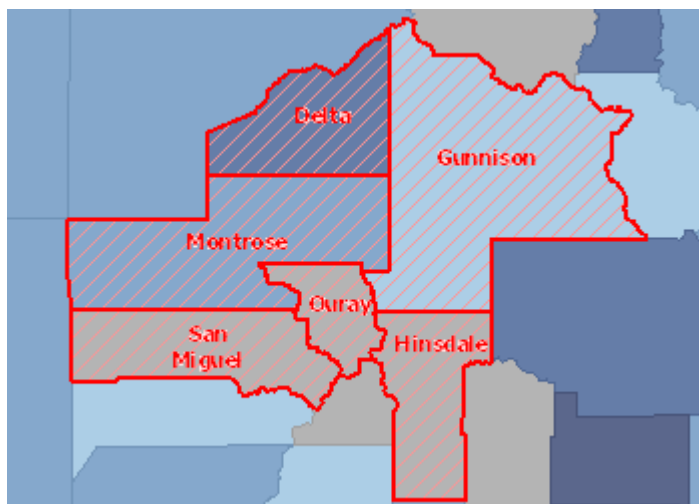

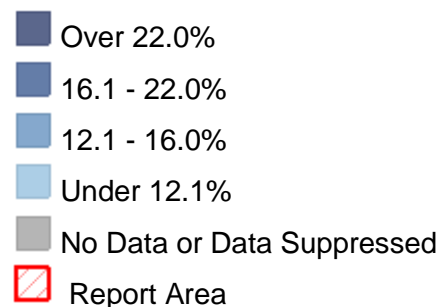
