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CHNA Purpose

- Focuses a hospital's time and resources on the most pressing health needs in the community
- Facilitates tracking and planning to show progress to the community
- Part of the required hospital documentation of "Community Benefit" under the Affordable Care Act (ACA) for 501(c)(3) hospitals

A list of contacts representing the following groups:

- Public Health Persons with special knowledge of or expertise in public health
- Departments and Agencies Federal, tribal, regional, State, or local health or other departments or agencies, with current data or other information relevant to the health needs of the community served by the hospital facility
- **Priority Populations** Leaders, representatives, or members of medically underserved, low income, and minority populations, and populations with chronic disease needs
- Chronic Disease Groups Representative of or member of Chronic Disease Group or Organization, including mental and oral health
- Broad Interest of the Community Individuals, volunteers, civic leaders, medical personnel, and others to fulfill the spirit of broad input required by the federal regulations

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Surveys & Data

- Round 1 Survey
 - Review prior CHNA significant health needs to determine if they should remain top health needs
- Round 2 Survey
 - Review data to make sure it is current and accurate
 - Allocate points to determine top health needs
 - Top health needs = ~60% of the votes


- Stakeholder Top Health Concerns

 - Access to Health: including uninsured, affordable prescriptions, access to specialists (possibly through telemedicine), and a pharmacy
 - 4. Senior Care and Assisted Living
 - Active Transportation including bike lanes, sidewalks, shoulders, and trails
 - 6. Capacity to Provide Health Services, especially public health services: including space for Public Health staff, broadband internet, more promotion of existing services
 - Access to Healthy Food: food security for children, access to fresh fruits and vegetables and low allergy food.



- The top three health issues rated as 'major' are Mental Health Issues (73.5%), Access to Mental Health/Substance Abuse Services (64.8%), and Suicide/Suicide Attempts (62.7%)
- The top three drug/substance abuse issues rated as 'major' are Adult Substance Abuse (52.4%), Youth Drug Use (41.1%), and Youth Alcohol Use (39.7%)
- The top three community issues rated as 'major' are Poverty (47.7%), Low Education Levels (29.6%), and Transportation for Healthcare Purposes (24.4%)

How would you rate the health of your community?


Answered: 385 Skipped: 88



- The top three items rated most important to a healthy community are Access to Healthcare & Other Services (63.3%), Good Jobs & Healthy Economy (48.7%), and Affordable Housing (32.3%)
- The top three household issues in the past 12 months rated as 'major' are Having a lot of Anxiety or Stress (27.8%), Experiencing Depression (15.8%), and Not Being Able to Access Affordable Dental Care (12.4%)


From a scale of 1 (worst possible) to 10 (best possible) how do you rate your overall health at this time?

Answered: 381 Skipped: 92




Including physical illness and injury, how many days during the past 30 days were you in poor physical health?

Answered: 379 Skipped: 94








In the past year, have you or any household member left the county in search of healthcare?






If you often seek primary healthcare outside of your county, what are the reasons why? (Select all that apply)

Answered: 315 Skipped: 158




How do you learn about the health services available in your community? (select top three)
